

**PRESIDENT**

Fellow members of Chapter 181,

As we watch summer turn to fall, so too do we watch the changes taking place in our NARFE organization. After much discussion at the National convention and a vote, there was an 80% approval to pursue the concept of "Future of NARFE" (FON). It was agreed that a strategic plan needs to be developed by a neutral third party; there needs to be a branding study to determine how to reach young people since young people, and even some older federal employees/retirees, don't know what NARFE is; and monies saved by eliminating two (2) National officers can be redirected toward other FON items (ex. a professional CEO; professional recruiter). The new 12-person National Executive Board [President, Secretary/Treasurer and ten (10) Regional V.P.s] will be asking for member input as they proceed with the FON concept.

The change from ten (10) regions to five (5) is on hold and will be voted on at the 2016 National convention.

The change from four (4) National officers to two (2) was passed; current National Treasurer Richard Thissen was elected as the next National President; Jon Dowie of Chapter 33 in St. Augustine, FL, was elected as the next National Secretary/Treasurer.

This year live video feeds were introduced on the National website as well as day-to-day write-ups, also posted on the website; the 2016 and 2018 National conventions will be streamed to registered members; in 2018 registered members can vote remotely (at home) using a "clicker" provided with their registration.

Because membership has dropped below 240,000, National is now doing a daily tracking. The organization is doing okay financially because of good investments, fund

raising, and contributions; however declining membership impacts income from affinity partners and advertising. As membership drops, NARFE has to renegotiate prices with advertisers. Office of Personnel Management Director, Katherine Archuleta, asked NARFE to help recruit young people into government service; this task is becoming more difficult as Congress cuts the benefits of federal employees. I urge you to help us recruit new members.

If you have not already done so, please turn to pages 31 through 40 in your October NARFE magazine. These pages show the voting record of your congressional representatives. Look down the “%” columns; if your representatives don’t have “100” in that column, call them - email them - write to them - go talk to them. NARFE needs their support to protect the earned benefits of federal workers and retirees. I appreciate your ongoing efforts.

The balance in our Alzheimer's account as of 31 August was \$108.59. Donations of \$50.00 were received from Lorraine Brockerman, Bea Bull, Rex Tauscher and Donald Taylor.

The annual "Walk To End Alzheimer's" for the Kitsap Peninsula took place as scheduled on 14 September 2014; donations received to date are \$39,642.26 with 321 walkers participating. The national Alzheimer's Association ([www.alz.org](http://www.alz.org)) now has a reference to the monthly activity for NARFE on their website including the History of NARFE's association with Alzheimer's research for the past 25 years with a total donation of over \$10,000,000.
