From Chapter Vice Presidents: I got the feeling at our December meeting with Rep. Kilmer that immigration reform might be a good topic for our March NARFE meeting. So, I contacted Mr. Ray Garrido, Board Member for the Kitsap Immigrant Assistance Center (KIAC), and asked him if he would come and talk to our group. He said he would be happy to talk to us about immigration reform. Their Family Services Center is located in the Hillcrest Church in, Bremerton. The center serves as a resource hub for the immigrant community in Kitsap and adjacent counties providing high quality, low cost immigration legal services to foreign born individuals and their families. In addition, the center provides many other services, for example: referrals to social and health services, instruction in English language skills, and emergency assistance.

Mr. Garrido will talk about their efforts to address two recent executive orders from President Obama, the Deferred Action for Parental Accountability (DAPA) and the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA). The DAPA is a program administered by US Citizenship and Immigration Services that provides temporary relief from deportation and work authorization to unauthorized parents of U.S. citizens. The DACA provides temporary relief from deportation and work authorization to certain young people brought to the United States as children—often called “DREAMers.” Because these executive orders are temporary, he will also discuss comprehensive immigration reform.

From Chapter Treasurer: The Chapter has a balance of \$3,943.57 in the bank as of February 15, 2015. The sudden jump in funds is attributed to five members of the Chapter who put in a lot of time at our Federation workshop. Thank you very much Stan & Lois Barber, Carolyn Minder, Bob Johns and Lyn Damschen for your effort to make the workshop a success. Another addition was due to two new recruited Chapter members.
